

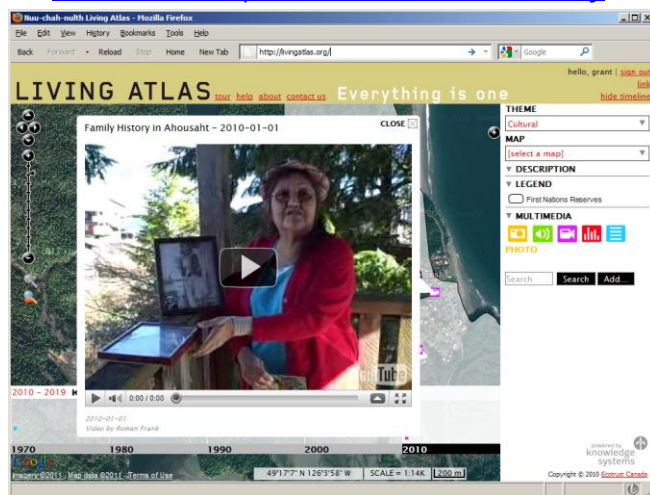
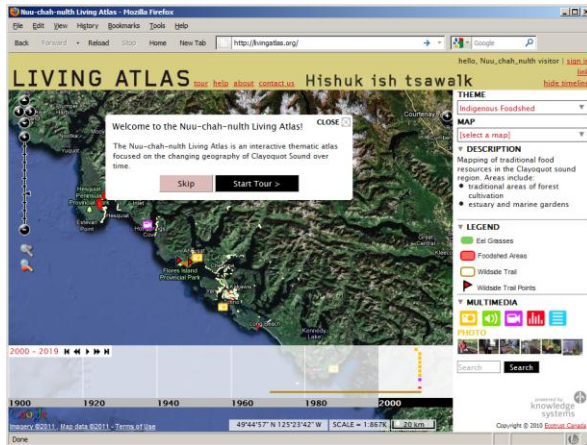
LIVING ATLAS

- Postgres/PostGIS relational database
- OpenLayers, MapServer, jQuery
- All components built with open source software



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
